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## Annual Notice of Student Academic Standards July 2023

The School District of Whitefish Bay is committed to using benchmarked and rigorous standards that influence the formation of the highest expectations for student performance as well as best prepare our students for success in college and career development. In Whitefish Bay our Teaching and Learning Department works closely in the Curriculum Renewal and Design process to understand the influence of multiple factors in determining the specific learning targets (what we want students to know and be able to do) to direct student learning. In order to align expectations for students with the District's desired learning targets for post-high school readiness, the School Board is committed to supporting content units of study through our Board adopted curriculum process (Policy 330).

Each content area is on a regular cycle of renewal and curriculum design. Learning targets (what students know and are able to do) influence the scope (depth of learning), sequence (order) and resources used in the learning process and are clearly delineated. In establishing curriculum for our students the School Board looks for the following characteristics:

- Clarity in purpose and measurable outcomes at each grade level;
- Collaborative teacher design of expected outcomes and delivery of skills and content;
- Benchmarking with other high performing schools/countries across the globe;
- Flexible and accessible learning so that all students can reach rigorous expectations.

National and international organizations, consisting of experts from post-secondary institutions and experts from K-12 institutions, have developed standards, frameworks and learning continuums within content areas. Many of these groups are continuously researching learning within their domain to ensure that teachers and learners are engaging in rigorous and developmentally appropriate learning.
