

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

Bay Robotics FTC Team #10829 finished as the #3 Alliance Captain in the World!! The team just completed an outstanding performance at the FIRST® FTC World Championship, competing for 4 days in Houston, TX. Congratulations to team members Miles Bockhorst, Dillon Buckley, Mario Stanescu, Felix Singer, Liam Murphy, and Liam Bruch and to Head Coach Sergio Lemaitre with the Outreach Coaches Friederike Lemaitre and Jim Wong. A big thanks to team sponsors for the financial support for the season and to the team parents for their support throughout the season and many who made the trek to Houston to cheer the team on.

Over 6000 FTC teams compete globally and the World Championship brought together the top 224 teams, with Bay Robotics being 1 of 3 teams representing Wisconsin. Worlds started with competitions in 4 Divisions of 56 teams. Bay Robotics won their division and finished as the #1 seed and the Winning Alliance Captain in their Division. In addition, Bay Robotics won the Design Award in their Division for both robot design/technology and aesthetics with a very cool robot casing that pays homage to the whitefish of Whitefish Bay and the sun of the Milwaukee flag. In the World Championship, Bay Robotics got to compete in the Semifinals. Congratulations to all!



Parent/Guardian and Community Member Representatives Sought for English Language Arts Renewal and Design Committee

Our district evaluates and improves every curricular subject area on a six to seven-year cycle through the work of curriculum review committees. Typically, one or two parents/guardians and community members serve on each committee. Beginning in fall 2024, the academic area of 4K – 12th grade English Language Arts will be reviewed.

Per School Board policy, interested parents/guardians and community members must apply to participate on curriculum renewal and design committees. Applications are reviewed by the Administrative Council. Parents/guardians and community representatives are selected based on the following criteria:

- Training, interest, or experience in this area
- Reasons for wanting to be on this committee
- Ability to contribute to meeting the goals set forth in the committee's purpose

English Language Arts Committee: The time commitment for representatives will involve six - eight meetings. Regarding the renewal and design process for the 2024-2025 school year, there will be more information coming at the start of next year which will include our goals (School Board Policy #334) and a timeline for the committee.
