Whitefish Bay High School is ranked #219 in the United States and #2 in Wisconsin, 2021 Best High Schools by U.S. News & World Report. The 2021 Best High Schools ranked approximately 17,860 public high schools based on a broad range of data to determine which high schools do the best job of preparing students for college

The 2021 Best High Schools rankings take a holistic approach to evaluating schools, looking at six factors: college readiness, reading and math proficiency, reading and math performance, underserved student performance, college curriculum breadth and graduation rates. Specifically, college readiness measures participation and performance on AP and IB exams.
