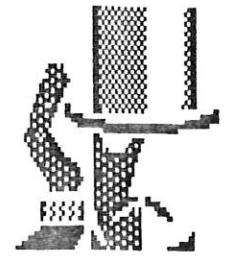

Frank Laycock will conclude a 34-year teaching career at the High School on June 11. In a time when longevity in one career and in one career location is uncommon, Mr. Laycock has provided Bay students and patrons of the theater with an outstanding continuity of professionalism and dedication to all areas of student life.

## DROP-IN CENTER OPENS
