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Whitefish Bay Continues Long History of Exceptional ACT Scores

WHITEFISH BAY, WI – The School District of Whitefish Bay celebrates its students achieving 18 consecutive years of average ACT scores of 25 or above. Whitefish Bay students received an *average composite score of 26* out of a possible 36 points on the nationally normed test for the 2016-2017 school year, according to test scores released through an ACT publication and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction. This score reflects 100% of our 2017 graduating seniors taking this assessment as it is the test of accountability in the State of Wisconsin at the high school level.

District Administrator Dr. John W. Thomsen reported, “We do not know of any other public school district in the state that has matched this high, long-standing record. Consistent ACT scores above 25 are just one reflection of the dedicated effort and commitment to education demonstrated by our students, their families, and our entire District staff. This is also a measurement of the commitment to developing strong student academic and 21st century skills while addressing the whole child in a supportive environment.”

According to an ACT publication, the 2017 average composite score for Wisconsin is 20.5. Wisconsin’s composite score has dropped from 22.2 in 2015 to 20.5 in 2016 and 2017 due to 100% participation of the 11th grade high school students taking this test as part of the school accountability process in Wisconsin (this began in 2016).

The curriculum based, multiple choice ACT test covers English, mathematics, reading and science. An optional writing test can also be taken. Because the ACT measures a student’s readiness for college coursework, the ACT is the test of choice for most colleges and universities, particularly those in the Midwest.
