PI 26.04 Requirements for Boards

- Provide <u>Academic and Career Planning (ACP) services</u> to students in grades 6-12 (began in fall 2017).
- Develop long range plan under PI 26.03.
- Publish the plan on the school district's website.
- Review the plan yearly.

PI 26.04 Requirements for Boards

- Pupil transcript indicates:
 - name of each course taken.
 - number of high school credits earned for each one.
- Report to include current progress and future goals to improve postsecondary outcomes.

The plan shall address:

- An analysis of local, regional, and state labor market needs.
- An analysis of the educational and training requirements for occupations that will fill those needs.
- ☐ Strategy to engage business, postsecondary education, and workforce development.
- Description of Career and Technical Education (CTE) programming available, staff professional development for ACP delivery, and how the school district will meet education for employment program requirements.
- Process to engage parents regarding ACP services provided and opportunities to participate.

Wisconsin's Vision for CTE

- Develop high quality Career Pathways (Plan of Study).
- Apply an *educational equity* lens to ensure all students have access to high quality CTE programs and career pathways.

Career Pathways

Districts must offer at least one career pathway to use Carl Perkins Funds:

 ONE locally adopted SERCP (state-endorsed regional career pathway program)

OR

ONE locally developed career pathway that meets minimum requirements for quality.

What needs to be in a Pathway?

Five quality elements in the same career pathway:

- 1. A progressive sequence of CTE courses aligned to current labor market needs.
- 2. A work-based learning experience.
- 3. Attainment of an industry-recognized credential.
- 4. A related dual-credit college course.
- 5. Related <u>Career and Technical Student Organization</u> (CTSO) activities that align with pathway skills.

Year one and two, pathways must offer 3 of 5 elements.

Year 3 and beyond, pathways must offer 4 of 5 elements.

WFB Received State Endorsement for Patient Care, Business Administration, and Digital Technology Pathways

How do we inform and involve families throughout students' academic and career planning processes?

- High school counselors meet individually with student and parents in grades 8 and 11, to work on the ACP.
- Middle school counselors meet individually with students in grades 6 and 7 to work on ACP.
- The Whitefish Bay High School counselors developed a four year plan to empower students to discover their own personal values and goals.
- With the integration of Naviance into the core curriculum of the college and career program, students and families have the opportunity to do an abundance of exploration and research. Parents and students are given login information.
- Parent information sessions are held annually for the following grade levels: 5, 8, 10, and 11.
- Parents are apprised of opportunities via Naviance, Family Access, and email from the counseling department.
- Parents receive letters pertaining to Naviance classroom lessons specific to learning objectives and encourage parents and students to discuss/review what was completed at school.

E4E: 2023-2024 School Year Goals

- Continued professional learning with counselors on how to build better business partnerships and mentorships will transpire (Academic and Career Planning and Regional Career Pathways Network through CESA #1).
- Continued development of Southeast Wisconsin Region Pathways for Whitefish Bay participation.
- Elementary counselors will meet in the fall of 2023-24 with building wide staff to explain in detail what the district's ACP plan consists of and how this will look at each individual school.
- Counselors to begin work on the profile of student at Elementary, Middle, and High School Levels.
