Whitefish Bay High School Junior/Senior Privilege 2020-2021

Description: Senior Privilege is typically an incentive-based program to acknowledge seniors for their academic success, strong attendance and appropriate behavior through six semesters at WFBHS. In lieu of taking a study hall during periods 1 or 7, Senior Privilege allows students to leave campus. For the first semester of the 2020-2021 school year, this program is being extended to BOTH juniors and seniors for periods 1, 4, 5, and 7 in order to help mitigate COVID-19 spread. Any extension for juniors will be reconsidered in January of 2021.

Initial Qualification:

- 1. Parental Consent
- 2. No unexcused absences the year prior
- 3. Cumulative GPA of 3.2
- 4. No suspendable offenses, school-related police citations or significant incidents of disrespect, insubordination, academic dishonesty or bullying behavior throughout the entirety of the year prior.
- 5. Successful completion of 32 credits by the end of junior year to include all required courses for grades 9-11. (For juniors, this would require 24 credits by the end of sophomore year)
- 6. Enrollment in six classes in addition to Junior/Senior Privilege. Students may <u>not</u> take a study hall in addition to Junior/Senior Privilege.
- 7. Students with an IEP may qualify if they have met academic and/or behavior criteria established by the IEP team. A meeting with the student, case manager and an administrator will be held prior to final approval.
- 8. Students who feel they meet the majority of the criteria but were denied Junior/Senior Privilege may appeal the decision by submitting a formal letter to the principal explaining the circumstances and why they feel deserving of the opportunity. A meeting will be held for final determination.

Ongoing considerations:

- 1. Students who do not meet initial cumulative GPA criteria for first semester may reapply for second semester if their GPA moves above a 3.2.
- 2. Students who enroll in WFBHS during senior year will be considered on a case by case basis.

Application Process:

- 1. Students who have study hall periods 1, 4, 5, or 7 and feel they meet the criteria for Junior/Senior Privilege may fill out an application and return it to the counseling office.
- 2. Students may NOT change their schedules to allow for Junior/Senior Privilege.
- 3. Students must complete the attached agreement and submit it to the Counseling Office for final verification.
- 4. Counselors will communicate final approval.

Violations: Students will be disqualified from Junior/Senior Privilege during second semester if any of the following occurs:

- 1. D or F in any of their classes
- 2. Unexcused absence
- 3. Chronic tardiness (5 or more) to the class that follows their release period (if 1st hour)
 - a) Students with an IEP may be disqualified if the IEP team-established criteria is not met.
 - b) Students will be immediately disqualified if they engage in a suspendable offense, school-related police citation or significant incident of disrespect/insubordination or bullying behavior.
- 4. Repeated behaviors that resulted in detentions, the accumulation of minors, etc may result in disqualification at the discretion of the administration.
- 5. Students who are disqualified will be placed in a study hall.

Related Processes:

- 1. Entering/Leaving: At the start of the hour for which students have Junior/Senior Privilege, they may leave through any door. Students who have Junior/Senior Privilege during hours 1 and 5 should enter through Door 1. They do not need to sign in, but must proceed through the main office.
- 2. Students who have Junior/Senior Privilege must leave campus. The only exception is if a student is directly supervised by a teacher to make up an assessment, etc. Students who remain unsupervised will have their privileges revoked.
- 3. Parents have the right to deny student's admittance by refusing to sign the initial contract. They may also request that their student be permanently un-enrolled at any time; however, revocation is permanent.

Junior/Senior Privilege Agreement

This agreement is between the parent, student and Whitefish Bay High School regarding Junior/Senior Privilege. Junior/Senior Privilege allows student to arrive late, leave early or leave campus in lieu of a study hall during periods 1, 4, 5 and 7. Confirmation or denial of Junior/Senior Privilege will be communicated to students via their counselor.

Registration/Application:

Any junior or senior who is enrolled in a 1st, 4th, 5th or 7th hour study hall and meets the qualifications may apply for senior privilege.

Qualifications:

- 1. No unexcused absences junior year
- 2. Cumulative GPA of 3.2 over six semesters
- 3. No suspendable offenses, school-related police citations or significant incidents of disrespect, insubordination, academic dishonesty or bullying behavior throughout the entirety of junior year.
- 4. Successful completion of 32 credits by the end of junior year or 24 credits sophomore year to include all required courses. Enrollment in six classes in addition to Junior/Senior Privilege. Students may <u>not</u> take a study hall in addition to Senior Privilege.
- 5. Students with an IEP may qualify if they have met academic and/or behavior criteria established by the IEP team. A meeting with the student, case manager and an administrator will be held prior to final approval.

Disqualification:

- Students will be disqualified from Junior/Senior Privilege opportunities during second semester if any of the following occurs: D or F in any of their classes, unexcused absence or Chronic tardiness (5 or more) to the class that follows their release period (if period 1).
- 2. Students with an IEP may be disqualified if the IEP team-established criteria is not met.
- 3. Students will be immediately disqualified if they engage in a suspendable offense, school-related police citation or significant incident of disrespect/insubordination or bullying behavior during first semester.
- 4. Repeated behaviors that resulted in detentions, the accumulation of minors, etc may result in disqualification at the discretion of the administration.
- 5. Students who are disqualified will be placed in a study hall.

I understand and agree to the criteria for Junior/Senior Privilege as outlined above. I understand that failure to meet the above criteria in any way will disqualify my student from participation in the program without appeal. I further understand that I have the right to permanently withdraw my student at any time, without opportunity for reinstatement. Unless supervised by one of their teachers, students must leave campus during Junior/Senior Privilege.
