#1 Ranked Blue Dukes Clip Orioles Wings

The #1 ranked Division 3 Whitefish Bay football team was a no-fly zone Friday night with Hartford in town. Led by defensive coordinator mastermind Coach Schoen and his tenacious Blue Dukes Defense, Whitefish Bay delivered a goose egg to the Orioles, holding them to 170 yards of total offense in route to a big 7-0 conference victory.

The Dukes controlled the ball for nearly 33 minutes on offense and grinded out 221 yards rushing on 54 carries. Senior running back Grover Bortolotti had another monster week, carrying the rock 28 times for 170 yards and a touchdown. Senior quarterback Jack Stecker led the offense to three fourth down conversions while also completing 4 of 7 passes for 35 yards.

The story of the night however, was the Blue Dukes defense. Hartford was only able to complete 12 passes on 28 attempts for 144 yards and rush for 28 yards on 12 carries. Bortolotti added another interception to his season total and teamed up with junior linebacker Nick Jorndt for a goal line stand that secured the victory for the Blue Dukes. With 2:37 left in the game and the Orioles on the Dukes 3-yard line, Bortolotti and Jorndt combined to force a fumble that was recovered by senior outside linebacker Heath Oberg.

With the victory, the Blue Dukes move to 3-0 on the season.

The season-best trend would continue through the night, as numerous swimmers posted lifetime best times in a definitive Blue Duke victory. The Dynamic Distance Crew continues to flex its muscle as junior Rachel Goldblatt, sophomore Ellie Lukas, and sophomore Maddy Cleverly all race to season-best 500 freestyles. Sophomore Annie Osswald continues to flex her sprinting prowess with a season-best 100 backstroke, posting a time faster than her conference-meet performance last year!

Varsity Girls Cross Country Team Wins 21st Consecutive Conference Championship

At Tendick Park, the girls' cross country team continued its impressive streak of conference championships by winning number 21 on Friday, October 9th. The team endured tough racing conditions to win the 10-team meet over second place Slinger. Freshman Lily Kriegel finished second place overall to earn first team all-conference honors. Second team all-conference honors were earned by freshman Josie Anzia, sophomores Maya Stevic and Natalie Miller, and senior Kealan McNally while sophomore Lydia Miller received honorable mention.

On the boy's side, shorthanded due to injury, the team finished second place to Homestead. It came down to the wire as a mere point separated the teams, proving to be a matter of a couple seconds over the five kilometer race. Junior Jonathan Lukas and senior Jacob Anzia earned first team all-conference honors. Junior Jonah Block received second team all-conference honors and senior Niko Martinez-Ortiz earned honorable mention.

The JV teams capped off their seasons with 2nd and 3rd place finishes by the girls and boys respectively.

Looking ahead, the teams hope to earn a spot at the WIAA State Meet by advancing through Sub-Sectionals on Monday, October 19th and Sectionals on Saturday, October 24th.



#2 Nationally Ranked Boys Soccer Team Repeats as Conference Champions

The United Soccer Coaches Association has ranked the Whitefish Bay boys' soccer team as the second best team in the nation. The Blue Dukes also received the top ranking in the state by the Wisconsin Soccer Coaches Association. The past two weeks, the team has handled those high expectations by going 5-0 and improving their season record to 12-0.

The Blue Dukes beat 8th ranked and rival Nicolet 3-0 on October 6th. The followed up that big victory with wins over Port Washington (7-1), New Berlin Eisenhower, which is ranked #2 in Division 2 (2-0), Slinger (3-0) and West Bend West on Senior Night (7-0).

With an undefeated record in the North shore Conference, the Blue Dukes repeat as conference champions and earned their 18th overall North Shore Conference Championship.
