The Blue Dukes have already competed against half of the Conference, and have yet to show a blemish on their record! The 4-0 start has been led by a terrific senior class. Adi Prasad, Andrew Hall, Gavin Zeng, Nick Enea, Peter McMahon, and Phil Swietlik have encouraged a culture of commitment and dedication that the team is already feeding off of to post state-leading relay times, and numerous top 10 individual, state-wide performances!

The boys flexed their strength with a commanding victory at the Conference Relay Meet, winning the meet convincingly for the second straight year. Winning 8 of the 13 possible events, the signature depth of talent here at WFB proved no match. "The Sprint Trio" of Peter McMahon, Phil Swietlik, and Peter Youel led the way, each participating in three winning relays. Rising distance star, sophomore Ben Ernster equaled the "three-victory performance" by providing multiple season-best 200 freestyle performances!

The boys head in the winter break geared for quality training and a break from the racing scene. They quickly return with three meets the first week back to school! Daunting to most, but nothing these Blue Dukes can't handle!



Boys Basketball Team off to Strong Start

The 10th ranked Whitefish Bay Boys' Basketball team put up a pair of 20 point wins last week defeating #4 ranked Cedarburg 76-56 and North Shore contender Grafton 56-36. Four seniors scored in double figures in the Cedarburg win; Andrew Clements (16), Jayden Jackson (16), Cullen Starker (14), and JD Cohen (14). Jayden Jackson led the way versus Grafton with 27 points. JD Cohen had 8 assists versus Grafton as well.

In this game, the defense stood out, with the Blue Dukes holding Homestead to only nine first half points and only three 2-point field goals for the game. Last night, the boys beat West Bend East 59-49 with Jackson leading the way with 24 points.

Overall, the team is 5-1 overall and 2nd in the North Shore Conference.
