Mission Accomplished! Your Boys Swim and Dive Team is the D2 State Runner-ups! An incredible feat, and the team's highest place since 2010. We could not be more proud of their talents and efforts. In most notable fashion, the 200 Free Relay capitalized on their undefeated postseason, and became the state champions, setting a new school record that had once been established since 1998. The team of Phil Swietlik, Nick Enea, Peter Youel, and Peter McMahon won the race wire-to-wire, only extending their lead with each swim! The boys solidified their 2nd place finish with a notable performance in the 400 Relay. Swimming in lane 7, away from the "excitement", Peter McMahon, Peter Youel, Phil Swietlik, and Andrew Hall produced a third place finish. Below are the results of each performance, each one as important as the last! The 2021 Boys Swim Team stamped their name in school history, and we are excited to continue the tradition for years to come!

Gymnastics Team Wins Conference and Sectionals, Sights Set on State Championship

What a two week stretch for our varsity gymnastics team as they competed in the North Shore Conference meet on Friday February 12th and in the WIAA Sectional meet on Friday, February 19th.

At Conference, there was tough competition and two of our athletes were rehabbing from injuries, so the girls had their work cut out for them. On each event, an athlete that competed on JV was brought up to compete for the varsity team. These ladies rose to the occasion posting season best scores and helped the team deliver another conference championship!!!

- Senior captain Addie Gallun lead the team by dominating the competition. With injuries of her own, she stayed focused on the team's goals and posted a season best all-around score of 37.65, winning the gold! She also won bars and vault and was 2nd on floor and beam. She is now the 4x North Shore Conference All-Around champion as well as 4x bar champion and 4x vault champion.
- Senior captain Madi Kogler rested all of her events except bars. She posted an 8.325 and placed 13th!
- Junior Kate Graham also had an amazing day and stayed poised throughout the day. She placed 4th on floor, 5th on bars, 6th on beam and 5th in all-around.
- Junior Anneh Britz was able to compete in two events which helped this team take the title. Doing her fearless routines with one hand due to an injury, she posted a 9.025 on floor! Then on beam, she stuck her beam routine and inspired her team!
- Junior Liz Gaeta scored an 8.85 on vault and placed 5th. She also filled in on bars and floor and posted great scores.
- Junior Erin Timms vaulted beautifully and filled in on beam. Her personal best beam score of 8.5 helped secure the win after another teammate had just fallen a couple of times.
- Freshman Ryann Wesley competed on floor hitting a personal best of 8.8. She had another impressive performance on bars. She had a few mishaps on beam but she exceeded expectations when she competed on the vault. Filling in for Kogler, she hit a huge vault for the first time this year and placed 4th with an 8.9!
- The JV team comprised of sophomore Kate Brugman and freshman Megan Curran did an amazing job despite the fact that some of their teammates were unable to compete. Brugman placed 3rd on vault, 3rd on bars and 3rd all around. Freshman Megan Curran had a stellar beam day, staying poised throughout! She also competed vault and floor posting nice scores! The team finished 6th overall.

Whitefish Bay High School was the site for the WIAA D2 Gymnastics Sectional Meet on Friday, February 19th. Ten teams competed for two berths in the team competition and five spots in the individual events and the all-around.

Whitefish Bay had tough competition from the Nicolet and Elkhorn but came out victorious, scoring 144.725, a season high team score!

- In the individual competition Gallun dominated once again winning all but one event and won the AA with a season high AA score of 37.650. She hit a huge vault scoring a 9.7 scoring .6 ahead of her competition. Also noteworthy is how well she and Kogler has lead this team as a captains. Both ladies kept this squad composed and cheered them on every step of the way, despite their own nagging injuries. They are two tremendous young ladies to say the least!
- Kogler competed in all around and hit a personal best all-around score of 35.325 and qualified on beam and vault with personal bests of 9.25 on beam and 9.025 on vault.
- Graham hit big all day long despite her nagging high ankle sprain. She was lead off on beam with a beautifully stuck routine that lit the beam team on fire! The team ended with five sticks on beam! Graham qualified on floor, beam and bars as well as the AA with a personal best of 36.1 placing 3rd.
- Britz, still rehabbing her hand injury was able to compete in two events one handed! She placed 5th on floor and 4th on beam, qualifying on both events with a beautifully stuck routine scoring a season high 9.225.
- Wesley qualified on beam, placing 2nd with a personal best 9.4 which was the highest beam score from Bay. An amazing routine without any bobbles!
- Rounding out the team was Gaeta, who placed 13th on bars and 11th on vault. Timms was an alternate on vault and beam. Brugman was alternate on floor and bars.

The Blue Dukes head to the WIAA State Championship on Saturday, February 27th in La Crosse, good luck ladies!!

On Saturday February 20th, the girls played #3 seed Chippewa Falls Co-op for the WIAA State Championship. In a physical, intense game which saw eight penalties called, the girls co-op team lost a heartbreaker in overtime 3-2. Carey ended with game with 4 shots on goal and assisted on the 2nd goal.

Congratulations to the WFB Ski Team on a terrific WI State Championship Race experience despite double digit sub-zero temperatures on February 14th and 15th. The girls team finished 13th of 19 teams, with leading individual finishes (out of 141 total girls) by senior Molly Keiper (57th), junior Sydney Urben (61st), junior Emilie Lesinski (62nd), and senior Abby Lim (79th). Also skiing strong for WFB were sophomore Lydia Lim, sophomore Ella Novinsik, and freshman Lily Girzadas. This year two WFB boys qualified for state as individuals. Senior Damon Katz finished 39th and senior Hunter Bania finished 60th (of 149 boys).

At the JV Conference Race on Thursday, February 18 at Alpine Valley both girls and boys JV teams qualified and competed against the top 10 teams in the conference.

The girls came in 2nd! 



Varsity Boys Basketball Team Wins Conference, Sees Season End in the Regional Final

The Whitefish Bay varsity boys' basketball team finished the season on Saturday, February 20th as they lost to Wisconsin Lutheran 62-67 (OT) in the WIAA Regional Final. The team finished the season with an overall record of 21-4 and a conference record of 16-2 which tied Cedarburg for the North Shore Conference Championship, their first conference championship since the 2009 season. The 21 wins is the most in a season since the 2008-09 team finished 21-2.

Statistically, the team averaged 56.9 points per game and only gave up an impressive 39.1 points per game, which put them as one of the best defensive teams in the state.

Individually, senior Jayden Jackson, who earlier in the year broke the school's scoring record, led the team in scoring, averaging 19 points per game and was second in rebounds with 5.2 per game. Senior Cullen Starker was second in scoring, 11.8 points per game and led the team in rebounds (6.6 per game) and assists (5.2 per game). Junior Ryan Carew finished third in scoring at 8.9 per game and led the team in 3's with 39 made. Finally, senior JD Cohen finished 3rd in rebounds at 4.2 per game and 2nd in assists at 3.7.
