Gymnastics Team Wins the WIAA Division 2 State Championship, Gallun Sets State Record

The Whitefish Bay girls' gymnastics team competed in the WIAA Division 2 State Championship on Saturday February 27th at Performance Elite Gymnastics in La Crosse.

This season was unlike any other, the ladies had battled injuries all season long but never gave up. Knowing they weren't 100%, they knew that winning the state title was not going to be easy. They all knew what was at stake and what needed to be done as a team to put themselves in contention for a championship and they did exactly that!! The team gave their all and even the coaching staff was in awe when they tallied the score.

Scoring a WIAA Division 2 state scoring record of 146.575 almost seemed inconceivable considering what the team had gone through all year. But indeed they did, breaking the WIAA state record by over two points and winning the WIAA Division 2 State Championship, their fifth state title in six years and 13th overall. The Blue Dukes had the high score in the beam, vault and uneven bars on their way to their total of 146.5750, the best of either division. Congratulations to captains Addie Gallun and Madi Kogler, Anneh Britz, Kate Graham, Erin Timms, Liz Gaeta, Ryann Wesley and alternate Kate Brugman. What an astonishing accomplishment for these young ladies!!!

In the individual competition, senior captain Addie Gallun had a historic day, she won three individual titles to tie former Whitefish Bay standout Beth Weber's all-time WIAA record of 10 individual championships.

Gallun claimed her third straight all-around title and captured first place in the uneven bars and vault. In winning the all-around title, which she won with a score of 37.7, she became the third gymnast in WIAA Division 2 history to win the event three times. Gallun's title in the bars (9.65) makes her the second Division 2 athlete to win four titles in that event. In addition to her 10 individual championships, she finishes her historic career with five silver medals and two bronze medals. Congrats to Addie and all her accolades!!

Co-captain Madi Kogler had a stellar day hitting personal bests on all four events! She hit a beautiful beam routine and took home silver!

Junior Kate Graham, hit a personal best on floor with a beautifully executed routine and placed 6th. She went on to finish 5th in the all-around having a great meet on all four events. Way to go!!

Junior Anneh Britz also had a superb day placing just behind her teammate on beam. Anneh placed 3rd on beam showing a ton of confidence especially since she was nursing a hand injury! Awesome job Anneh!

Freshman Ryann Wesley qualified on beam but had an unfortunate fall taking her out of medal contention. She recovered from that to have a stellar day in all events!
