### **WNS Girls Lacrosse Program Off to a Good Start**

After two sets of games, the Wolfpack is off to a good start! The varsity team is 1-1 on the season with a tough loss at Waukesha followed by a solid 17-6 win at Cedarburg on April 19th.

In the game against Waukesha, junior Daisy Satran (Whitefish Bay) led the scoring with four goals, followed by Maddie Buckley (Nicolet) with two and Lily Johnson (Nicolet) with one.

In the victory against Cedarburg, the Wolfpack offense was led by Satran, sophomore Chloe Bowers (Whitefish Bay), and Olivia Evans (Shorewood) with six, four, and two goals respectively. Buckley grabbed five of the teams 20 groundballs and Goalie Lauren Reichert (Whitefish Bay) turned in an excellent showing with 6 saves.

The JV team is also off to a great 2-0 start. At Waukesha, the girls were able to tough it out with an 8-7 win. Six players scored in the game which was awesome! At Cedarburg, the JV continued with their winning ways, besting Cedarburg 8-4. Again, offensive power was spread out with 4 different players scoring. Defensively, Goalie Carolina Pierri (Nicolet) had 12 saves on 16 shots.

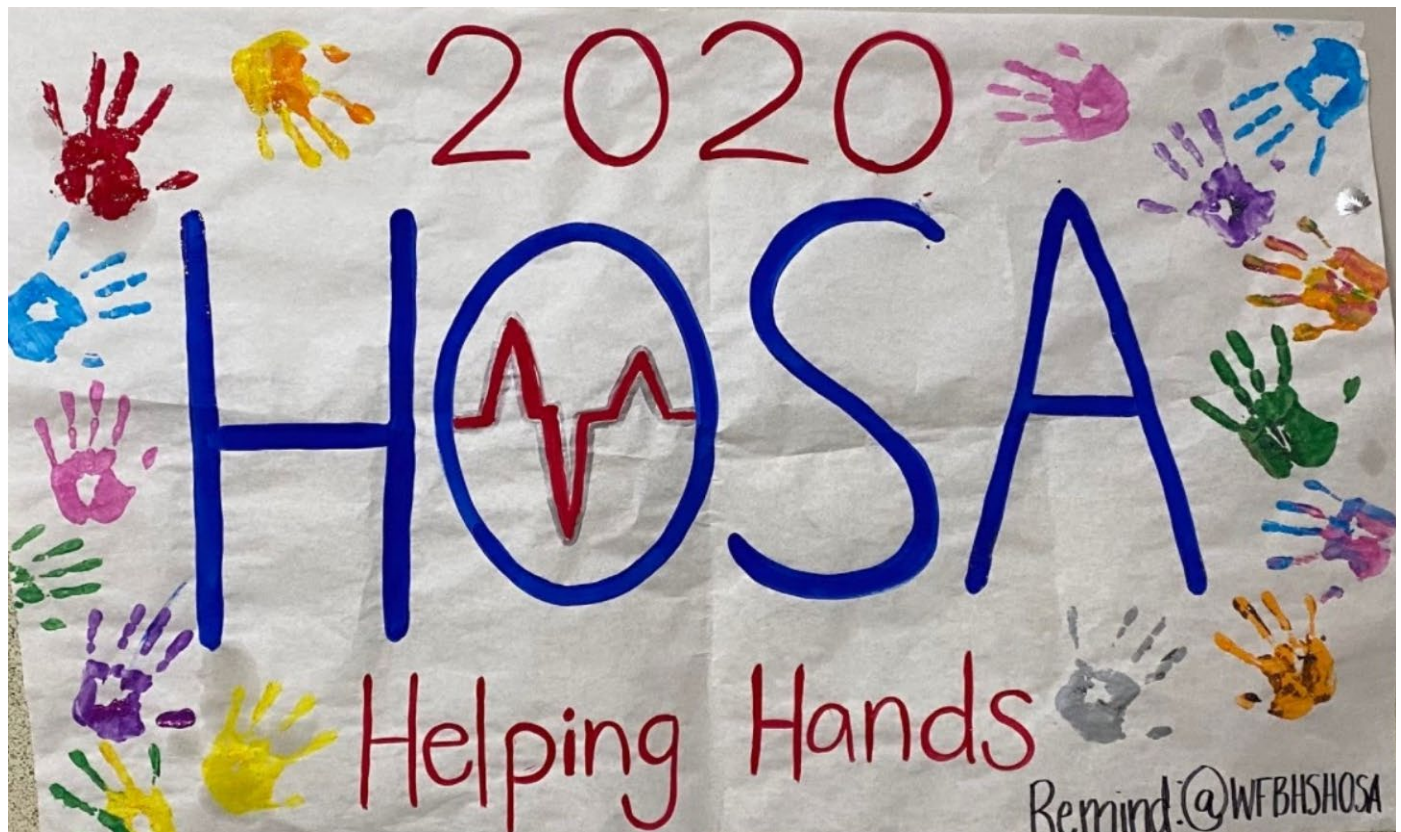
The Wolfpack's next games will be on 5/5/21 at USM.
