## Varsity Football Team Wins North Shore Conference, Advances to Level 3 in the WIAA Playoffs

### Dukes Handle the Owls (October 15, 2021)

The Whitefish Bay Blue Dukes held on against the Slinger Owls, 21-14, at Lubar Stadium on Friday Night to win back-to-back outright conference championships. The Blue Dukes would go on to earn the 2-seed in the Division 3 Playoffs later in the night.

The Dukes used a balanced rushing attack to take a 21-7 lead into the half. Senior Jack Nau put the home team on the board first by taking a jet sweep around the end for an 11-yard touchdown. Nau's 4th rushing touchdown of the year capped off a 13-play drive to start the game that took just over five and a half minutes. The Owls, however, would tie it up at 7 on their ensuing drive.

After each team was forced to punt on their next possessions, the Dukes turned to the ground again to go up 14-7. Facing 3rd and 5 from the Slinger 36, the Dukes fed Sean Callahan on the next 4 plays, with the junior running back scoring from 16-yards out with 4:41 left in the first half.

Callahan wasn't content with a 7-point lead, however, and intercepted a deep Slinger pass on the very first play of their next possession. Five plays later, senior Nigel Cheeks found a seam and scampered in for a 35-yard touchdown. Junior Aleks Sauer-Milli's 3rd extra point of the half was good to give the Dukes the 21-7 lead into the break.

With a tough Owl defense keeping the Dukes off the board in the second half, a stingy Dukes D held strong to finish off the game and give Bay a 2nd straight conference title. Senior Mike Strecansky added an interception and a tenacious defensive line led by senior Reid Jamerson and senior Joe Brunner wreaked havoc in the backfield. Jamerson added two sacks on the night and Brunner got one. Senior Nick Lewis led the team with 8 tackles, with Callahan and senior Dom Bartolone adding 7 tackles each. Slinger gained just 196 yards of total offense on the night.

### Dukes Dominate the Vikings (WIAA Playoffs: Level 1, October 22, 2021)

The (2) Whitefish Bay Blue Dukes advanced to Level II of the Division Three Playoffs on Friday night, eliminating the (7) New Berlin West Vikings, 36-6. It was the Dukes' first home playoff win at Lubar Stadium since the 2017 season and their 5th straight win this season.

While the Bay offense struggled to get going in the first half, the Dukes D shut down everything the Vikings tried to do and gave them no breathing room. On the night, the Dukes D forced 7 Viking three-and-outs and 12 punts. With all 11 pursuing to the ball on seemingly every play, the Bay defense allowed just 78 yards of total offense, including 44 yards on 38 rushing attempts. Bartolone led the team with 11 tackles and Jamerson (1.5), Strecansky (1), and senior Henry Hissrich (0.5) combined to give the D three sacks. Even more impressive, the vaunted Dukes D had a jaw-dropping 11 tackles for loss in the game, with Bartolone, Jamerson, and Hissrich adding two each.

The Dukes put their first one in the endzone on their second drive of the game. After Cheeks returned a punt 17-yards to the Vikings 18, senior QB1 Luke Wells called his own number and snuck it into the endzone from the 1-yard line to give WFB a 7-0 lead with 4:16 left in the first quarter.

The Vikings' defense would keep Bay in check offensively until just before halftime. Starting at their own 14 and with only 40 seconds left in the half, the Blue Dukes called upon Cheeks to get them down the field. On the very first play of the drive, the senior running back burst through the line and found himself in the endzone 86-yards later to put his team up 14-6 at the break.

Cheeks would add his second touchdown of the game early in the third quarter, this time on a 34-yard run in which he had to break multiple tackles and hurdle over a pile of defenders.

After one of the many three-and-outs from New Berlin West midway through the third, Cheeks went back deep to field the punt and ended up with his third score of the game, taking it to the house from 56-yards away to give the Blue Dukes a 29-6 lead heading into the final quarter. Cheeks' night was done after racking up 163 rushing yards on 10 carries and 109 return yards on 6 punts.

Facing 3rd-and-9 from the Viking 10, Wells found senior wideout Kamarion Ivory in the endzone on a comeback route for their last score to push the lead 36-6. The pitch and catch were the 4th time this season Wells and Ivory found the endzone together. Despite their frustrating start, the Bay rushing attack gained 262 yards on 33 attempts for an average of 7.94 yards per attempt.



Dukes Sink Pirates in Overtime (WIAA Level 2, October 29, 2021)

The (2) Whitefish Bay Blue Dukes emerged victorious in an overtime thriller against the (3) Port Washington Pirates, 20-14, in a Division Three Level II Playoff game at Lubar Stadium on Friday night. It was the Dukes' 6th straight victory and moves them into Level III for the first time since the 2017 season.

With a misting rain and a strong, swirling wind the entire evening, both teams battled the elements and delivered an instant classic that will be talked about for years to come.

After a quick 1st quarter in which neither offense could get anything going, the Pirates struck first with 6:16 remaining in the first half on a 6-yard rushing touchdown that came on 4th and 1. The Blue Dukes were able to move the ball down the field on the ensuing drive right before halftime, but couldn't finish it off and gave the ball back to Port Washington on downs. The Pirates let the clock run down to the half and took a 7-0 lead into the break.

With 3:10 left in the 3rd quarter, Bay was finally able to put a complete drive together and marched down the field with a 5-play, 65-yard drive that took just 2 minutes and 19 seconds to even the score at 7-7. Quarterback Luke Wells found Bartolone for a 35-yard screen pass that would set up a 15-yard shovel pass to senior Jack Nau on the very next play.

The highly-regarded Dukes D did their job and forced a quick punt on the next Port drive, giving the ball back to a Bay offense that was just finding their rhythm. Facing a 3rd and 4 from the Blue Dukes 26, Cheeks broke off one of his signature sensational runs and found the endzone to put the Dukes up 14-7.

The Pirates didn't go down without a fight, however. Starting on their own 44-yard line with 3 minutes left in the game, the Port offense converted three 4th downs and tied the game at 14-14 with no time left on the clock to send it to overtime.

With the Dukes winning the toss in sudden death, they elected to start on defense. Except for an incidental facemask penalty, the Duke D stood tough and forced a 30-yard field goal attempt. An attempt it was, as Strecansky flew around the edge untouched for the block.

The Bay O did what they've done all year when it was their turn, playing smashmouth football and running downhill. On their 5th play of OT, which were all rushes, Bartolone found the endzone from the 4-yard line to end the game and send the Dukes to the next round.

Bartolone finished with 78 yards on 15 carries and Cheeks had his third straight 100-yard game with 124 yards on 17 attempts. Wells was efficient in the air, completing 5 of 6 passes for 61 yards.

Defensively, Jamerson added another sack to his season total to go along with 3 tackles for loss. Bartolone and fellow senior inside linebacker Nick Jorndt each added two more tackles for loss. Jorndt led the team with 12 total tackles on the night.

The Blue Dukes advance to the WIAA Level 3 Playoffs on Friday, November 5<sup>th</sup> where they host the Pewaukee Pirates. Game time is at 7:00pm.



## Girls Cross Country Team Wins Conference and Sectionals, Boys Team Send 2 to State

### North Shore Conference Championship at Heritage Trails County Park (October 16<sup>th</sup>)

At the conference championship race on October 16th, the Blue Dukes won 3 out of 4 races as the JV teams wrapped up their season. On the boys' JV side, three runners in the top four proved keys to earning the team the conference title as they scored 39 points to runner-up West Bend West's 47. The JV girls won their race in dominant fashion with 16 points, just one point short of a perfect score as all five scoring runners were in the top six overall. Sophomore Freya Stratte led the way with her second individual win in as many races.

Varsity boys earned a third-place finish while seniors Jonah Block and Jonathan Lukas, just back from a season-long injury, earned first team all-conference honors placing 7th and 10th, respectively. Senior Owen Bostwick also left with second team all-conference honors after a 15th place finish. As for the varsity girls, the tradition of excellence was on full display as they won their 23rd consecutive North Shore Conference Championship. The girls scored 33 points to runner-up Slinger's 103 points and on the individual front sophomore Lily Kriegel, junior Natalie Miller, freshman Kate Nicolet, senior Caroline Davis, and junior Lydia Miller earned first team all-conference honors while junior Maya Stevic and sophomore Mary Block earned second team honors and Josie Anzia earned honorable mention. In continuing their long winning streak and asserting themselves as the team to beat in the North Shore Conference, the girls were well primed for Friday, October 22nd's sectional meet.

### **Division 1 WIAA Sectional Meet at Lincoln Park Golf Course (October 22<sup>nd</sup>)**

Hosted at Lincoln Park Golf Course, the sectional meet saw great performances by both varsity teams. Despite great efforts, however, the boys team came up short of a state meet qualification and finished 3<sup>rd</sup>, with only the top two teams advancing. Block and Lukas were able to earn individual qualifier positions by finishing in the top-five individuals not on a state-qualifying team. They will be two of fifty individuals and 140 team racers competing on Saturday, October 30<sup>th</sup> at the Ridges Golf Course in Wisconsin Rapids.

The girls' team will be joining Block and Lukas as they won the sectional meet led by a 1-2 finish by Kriegel and Natalie Miller. In addition to the strength out front, depth continued to be a huge asset as Stevic, Lydia Miller, and Block rounded out the scoring runners and all finished the 5-kilometer race in under 20 minutes.

### **WIAA State Championship at Ridges Golf Course (October 30<sup>th</sup>)**

On Saturday, October 30<sup>th</sup> the girls' cross country team as well as seniors Jonathan Lukas and Jonah Block competed at the state meet in Wisconsin Rapids. Competing as individuals, Lukas and Block turned in strong performances finishing in 29<sup>th</sup> and 91<sup>st</sup> place, respectively. While not the finish they would have hoped for, Lukas' return after a stress reaction was inspiring and Block raced through a sinus infection and asthma acting up. Both boys will be missed on the team next year.

The girls team finished 4<sup>th</sup> in Division 1, a mere 9 points away from 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Led by junior Natalie Miller's 17 points, the team is poised to return a state-contending team in 2022 as the only graduating state racer is Caroline Davis. Other competing athletes include juniors Lydia Miller and Maya Stevic, sophomores Mary Block and Lily Kriegel, and freshman Kate Nicolet.

The Lady Blue Dukes used the last two weeks to wrap up the regular season, and build exciting momentum as the conference meet looms. In their final home meet of the year, the Girls Swim and Dive team hosted the Hartford Union squad as we celebrated our parents and seniors. Winning the meet in commanding fashion, the Seniors made sure to go out on a high note! Senior Grace Harrison led the way winning both of her individual events, the 200 Individual Medley, and the 100 Backstroke, both in season-best performances! Senior Natalie Nelson joined the winning circle with a season-best 100 butterfly. Seniors Rachel Goldblatt and Felicity Gresnick made their debut in new events for the year; the 500 freestyle and 200 individual medley, respectively. Both girls would bring home second place in each race! It's hard to fathom what our team will be next year, but we know we will miss our seniors dearly!

The Blue Dukes then got their first taste of the D2 State Meet, crossing the street to Shorewood for the Small School State Invitational. The 14-team invite hosted the major players in Division 2 swimming, giving the Dukes a great idea what they are preparing for. Our divers flexed their muscle, giving the Dukes a distinct advantage moving to the swim portion of the meet. Seniors Kate Graham and Anneh Britz posted 4th and 5th place finishes, with Sophomore Ryann Wesley and Senior Lucy Sarnowski following close behind in 11th and 14th. All four girls scoring points leads to great potential for a run at state! Casey Stephens led the way on the swimming side, posting a 3rd place finish in the 500 free. Casey will look to defend her state title in a few short weeks!

In their final dual meet of the season, the Lady Dukes surprisingly played host to the Port Washington Pirates. Taking advantage of the sudden home meet, Kate Graham took to the diving board, and put on the best female diving performance ever at Whitefish Bay High School. Not only did Kate break the 6-dive school record by 19 points, but she took down the pool record by 5 hundredths of a point! We could not be prouder of Kate and our impressive diving core! The swim meet was in favor of the Dukes wire-to-wire, highlighted by a few monumental performances. Freshman Isabelle Cleverly picked up two victories in the JV 50 and 100 free, and Sophomore Margaret Murphy boasted a major season-best in the 200 Freestyle. Sophomore Francesca Counts dominated the 100 Backstroke in a season-best fashion, emphasizing the great momentum these ladies have built heading into the postseason!

The Lady Blue Dukes went to Port Washington this Saturday, October 30th with an opportunity 33 years in the making. A balanced depth and consistently strong performances kept the Blue Dukes in the hunt more than halfway through meet! While their incredible efforts fell just short of the title, the Blue Dukes came home a second-place team finish; their third continuous year of climbing higher in the conference standings. 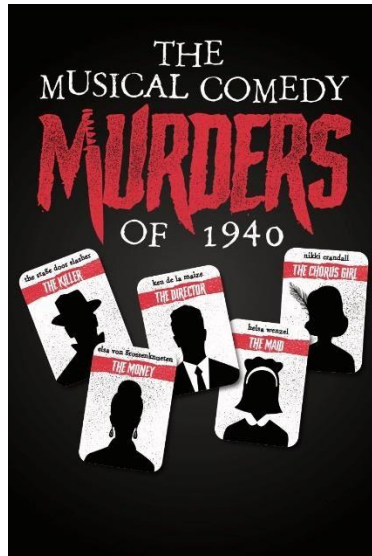

## Varsity Boys Soccer Team Win Conference and Sectionals, Advance to State

Our varsity boys' soccer team finished up the regular season with a 1-1 tie with Homestead High School on October 12<sup>th</sup>. With a 7-0-2 conference record, the Blue Dukes are Co-North Shore Conference champions, their 3<sup>rd</sup> conference championship in a row and 19<sup>th</sup> overall. With the post season starting, the squad did not disappoint and went 3-0 in the WIAA playoffs, earning their 5<sup>th</sup> trip to State in the past 9 years. They are looking to win their first title since 2017 and their 8<sup>th</sup> state championship overall.

The road to state started with the WIAA Regional Championship, where they beat 8<sup>th</sup> seeded Port Washington 4-0 on October 23<sup>rd</sup> at Lubar Stadium. Senior goalkeeper Nason Lancina posted the shutout and had two saves, while seniors Charlie Mitchell, Ben Grimm and Mitchell Dryden (2) all scored goals.

In the WIAA Sectional Semifinal they knocked off 4<sup>th</sup> seed Wauwatosa West 3-0 on October 28<sup>th</sup> and earned their trip to the WIAA State Tournament with a 4-1 win over 6<sup>th</sup> seed Oshkosh North in the Sectional Final, on October 30<sup>th</sup>.

The team is the 2<sup>nd</sup> seed in the Division 2 WIAA State Tournament and will play 3<sup>rd</sup> seeded Brookfield Central at 7pm on Friday at Uihlein Soccer Park. The State final will be on Saturday at 7pm.
