


# #1 Ranked Varsity Baseball Team Taking Care of Business

The Whitefish Bay varsity baseball team is ranked #1 in the latest Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association poll. With a 16-1 record, the Blue Dukes have been rolling and getting ready for their post season run.

Last week was a great example of how the season has been going for the Blue Dukes. On Monday, May 9<sup>th</sup> they traveled to Grafton for a North Shore Conference matchup. They ended up winning 16-3 in 5 innings behind 5 strong innings from junior pitches, Gavin Farnsworth. Offensively, junior Austin Wienke and senior Mitch Voit led the way with homeruns and each player ended with 4 RBIs.

Next, the Blue Dukes faced Cedarburg at Cahill Park on Wednesday, May 11<sup>th</sup>. Due to the postponed of their first matchup, the teams needed to finish the first game before starting the 2<sup>nd</sup> game. With a 5-3 lead from the first time, the Blue Dukes held on to a 6-3 victory. In their regular scheduled game, senior pitcher Mitch Voit was quite impressive going 7 innings, 10 strikeouts and only 1 hit allowed in a 7-0 win. Sophomore shortstop JD Dix had an equally impressive performance at the plate, crushing 2 homeruns to lead the Blue Dukes.
