Varsity Girls Track Team Wins Sectionals, Advance 16 To State

As the season is winding down, the Whitefish Bay girl's varsity track team is peaking at the right time! First up was the North Shore Conference meet held at Grafton High School on May 17th. The lady Blue Dukes ran really well and finished in 2nd place in very close team battle losing out to Homestead by two points. The last couple weeks also saw sophomore Essence Burrows break the school record in long jump and four days later junior Lola Kolawole reclaimed that school record. Sophomore Ryann Wesley outright broke her school record in pole vault twice, beating the previous record by 6 inches.

The team then traveled to Milwaukee Pulaski on Tuesday, May 24th for the WIAA Regional meet. The girls finished with the Regional Championship by scoring 176 points, which was 31 points better than the 2nd place team. The girls ended up winning 12 events that day!

With only one day of rest, the Blue Dukes then traveled to Arrowhead High School for the WIAA Division 1 Sectional meet on Thursday May 26th and in a loaded Sectional with some of the top teams in state, the Blue Dukes dominated and won the Sectional Championship with 145 points, 59 points better than the second-place team!

Boys Track Team Wins Regionals, Places 3rd at Sectionals, Send 13 to State

As we near the end of the season, the Whitefish Bay varsity boys track team has buckled down for a fierce state run. After winning the Milwaukee Pulaski Regional on May 24th, the Whitefish Bay boys came back on May, 26th to compete and earn tickets to Lacrosse for the WIAA State Track & Field Meet!

Advancing to State in the Shot & Discus is senior Joe Brunner, who won both events in the Sectional meet. Senior Nigel Cheeks, sophomore Landon Gallun, senior Reid Jamerson, & junior Will Smith got the baton around the track in the 4x100 meter relay to advance to the state meet as well, finishing in 3rd place.

Smith also qualified for the open 200 by winning the WIAA Sectional, his time of 21.97 is the top time currently in the state. Our boys distance crew took care of business advancing our 4X800 meter relay team to state with a great race with a 3rd place finish. That team is composed of senior Jonathan Lukas, senior Owen Bostwick, super freshman Jacob Jones and anchored by senior Jonah Bloch.

Notable performances came from senior Michael Strecansky in the High Jump, senior Mitchell Dryden and Landon Gallun in the open 200 & long jump all just missing state in their single events.



Blue Duke Golfers Ends Season at Regionals

The Blue Dukes Boys Golf Team had 45 players on the 2022 Roster, 15 seniors, 9 juniors, 12 sophomores and 9 freshmen. The varsity team had 19 players and played in 11 matches. Four juniors and one sophomore played in one or more Varsity matches. The JVs played in 8 matches and the JV2s played in 8 matches. Every player on the roster played in one or more matches.

The JVs finished the year 6 out of 10 teams in the North Shore Conference. The Varsity completed their season May 24 with the Regional Tournament. Whitefish Bay was grouped by the WIAA in arguably the toughest Regional in the State. Though the Varsity did not go on to Sectionals, junior Nate Twente came within 1 stroke of going to Sectionals as an individual player by shooting a score of 81.

The Blue Dukes look forward to having a strong team in 2023 with 5 returning Varsity players along with good, developing sophomore and freshmen players.

Softball Team Ends Season in Regionals, Excited for Future

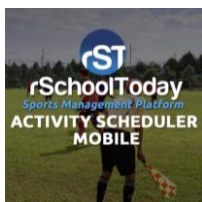

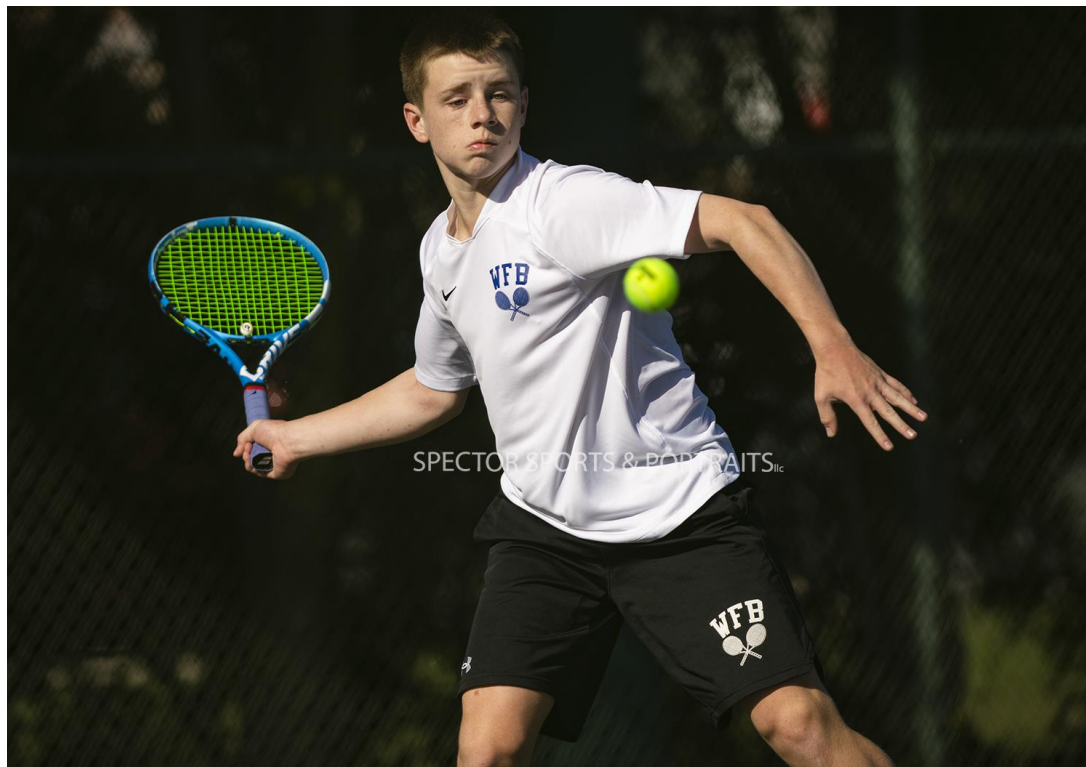
Then over the weekend of May 6th, the tennis team played pretty strong in the Nicolet Invite. Sophomore Mathew Noack beat his Madison Memorial opponent 6-2 , 6-0 in a quick match. That same day, sophomore Tyler Schneider defeated his Kenosha Tremper opponent in an easy 6-2 , 6-3 match. Along with that, sophomore Luke Paulson took home two dubs against Kenosha and Oshkosh West. In a not so easy match, senior Jeff Zhao came out on top against Homestead 6-4 , 6-3. Overall, the Nicolet Tournament was pretty successful for the Blue Dukes!

On May 13th and 14th, the boys traveled out to Madison at 7:40 am for the first part of their two-day tournament. They played Verona and Marquette. They beat Verona in a quick 6-2. Obviously, it isn't normal for there to be a total of eight matches. However, team manager Harry Brown took the court by a storm with his doubles partner Luke Johnson and obliterated their opponents. #1 Ranked Baseball Team Wins Conference, Ready for Playoffs

The last week of conference was highlighted by the third straight season that Whitefish Bay has been unanimous conference champions in baseball. During the three year stretch the combined overall record for Whitefish Bay is 50-4 and only one of those losses was at Cahill Park! First up on May 16th was a 14-4 win at West Bend East. The offense exploded with senior Mitch Voit having four hits including a HR and four RBI's. Senior Jack Nau joined Mitch with a HR and 4 RBI's of his own. On May 19th, the offense stayed hot with a 14-4 win versus Nicolet. Sophomore JD Dix was the main contributor being a perfect 3-for-3, which included a homerun, and finished the game with five RBIs. The conference season ended with a matchup versus Slinger on May 20th, which resulted in another impressive offensive showing for a 12-6 win. Senior Mitch Voit had a double and a pair of triples, driving in one in the process. The trio of seniors Michael Lippe, Ryan Carew, and Caleb Bowers each tallied two hits and combined to drive in seven runs. The Blue Dukes capped off the conference season with an impressive 17-1 record!

The last week of regular season play slated the Dukes with 3 non-conference home games, highlighted by the Monday matchup versus Franklin which is the 2nd ranked team in state. Senior Mitch Voit started on the mound, pitching 6 2/3 innings, tallied 10 strikeouts and allowed just three hits in route to the shutout 5-0 win. Voit showed off his two-way skills as he tallied two singles to drive in one run, while seniors Caleb Bowers and Jack Nau both contributed an RBI as well. Junior Jack Counsell also put together a solid day as he drove in one run on a single in the fourth that extended Bay's lead to three. Following the Franklin victory, Thursday, May 26th brought another 5-inning victory versus the Waukesha South 10-0. Senior Bennet Woodliff was dealing for the Blue Dukes as he went the distance and only allowed one hit while striking out five. Sophomore JD Dix helped power the offense with a HR (6th of the year) and 3 RBI's. The final regular season game is tonight against Wauwatosa West and will host the regional championship at Cahill Park on Thursday June 2nd versus the winner of Nicolet vs Wauwatosa West.
