#### Varsity Girls Cross Country Team Wins Sectionals, Advance to State and Boys Team Places 6th

#### North Shore Conference Meet (October 15<sup>th</sup>):

All four cross country teams competed at the North Shore Conference Meet at Tendick Park on October 15th. The boys' JV team narrowly finished second to West Bend West while the girls' JV won in dominant fashion led by individual champion freshman Colette Kriegel. The varsity boys finished 3rd as senior AJ Springer led the way with a 4th-place finish and first team all-conference honors. The girls team turned in an impressive performance, finishing 2nd to state-favorite Slinger.

#### WIAA Sectional Meet (October 22<sup>nd</sup>):

The boys' varsity team's strong season came to an end at the sectional meet. Senior John Bartschat led the way for the Dukes as he covered the 5k course in 17:05, finishing two spots out of individual qualification. The girls are headed to the WIAA State Tournament Meet in Wisconsin Rapids on October 29th after winning the sectional meet. Moving up 13 spots in the last mile, they demonstrated smart racing to win when it counts. Senior Natalie Miller led the way with an individual runner-up finish covering the 5k course in 18:59. Joining her at the state meet are fellow senior Lydia Miller, juniors Freya Stratte and Mary Block, and sophomores Kate Nicolet, Paige Haglund and Ixzel Rios.

Honkamp is the first individual to qualify from Whitefish Bay in nearly a decade and represented the Blue Dukes extremely well. Honkamp had her best performance on Day 1 when she shot an 81. The day was highlighted by several birdies in a row in the middle of her round in which she continuously made some very difficult chips and putts. On Day 2, Honkamp was steady throughout the day and shot an 85. Her two-day performance resulted in her having the best two-day combined score for any sophomore in the tournament and was second best for all underclassmen. It was a great and invaluable experience for Daniella and a big step for a program that hasn't reached these heights for a long time.

Girls varsity tennis team added to their season successes at the WIAA State Individual Tournament in Madison on October 13<sup>th</sup> through October 15<sup>th</sup>. State tournament participants, juniors Bryn Gonzalez and Hannah Griggs in doubles, junior Grace Wu and sophomore Elena Kemp in doubles and freshman Clare Schaefer in singles, all won their first round matches on Thursday.

On Friday, Bryn Gonzalez and Hannah Griggs won their second-round match against Franklin and then lost to eventual State runner-up Cedarburg in a third set tiebreaker. Grace Wu and Elena Kemp lost in the second round in a third set tiebreaker to highly seeded Hudson.

Clare Schaefer avenged a regular season loss to the No. 1 singles player for Sun Prairie East who finished 5th in State the year before. Clare finished her strong showing with another win on Saturday to place 6th in State to end the tournament. The girls supported each other throughout the season, and performed at a high level, including at the State tournament. The team also wants to recognize their great seniors: Katie Kops, Liesl Vorlop and Riley Franklin, who served as captains and great examples for the young and talented team. Great job girls!

#### Varsity Boys Soccer Team Ends Regular Season with Impressive Win, One Game Away from State

The varsity boys' soccer team traveled to Homestead on October 11<sup>th</sup> needing a win to secure the North Shore Conference championship. With Bay having a conference tie with Nicolet and Homestead being undefeated, the win was needed on the road. In a game that was played in a monsoon, the boys weren't able to put one in the back of the net in the final 20 minutes and tied 1-1, which gave Homestead the conference title. The goal was scored by junior Quin Muderlak and assisted by sophomore David Kleiner.

The team then set their sights on state rival Marquette on October 15<sup>th</sup> at Lubar Stadium. With both teams ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in their divisions by the Wisconsin Soccer Coaches Association, all eyes around the state were on this game. After the Blue Dukes gave up a penalty kick early in the first half, the team went to work and senior Henry Triggs tied the game with an assist from freshman Alec Jacquart. Two minutes before half, senior Alex Nicolet put away a beautiful goal, assisted by freshman Tucker Drane to put the Blue Dukes up 2-1. The second half was back and forth with the Blue Dukes outshooting Marquette 6-3 and holding on to an impressive 2-1 victory to end their regular season.

As the number 1 seed in their sectional, the Blue Dukes received a bye the first round and a match up with the ninth seeded Kaukauna in the WIAA Regional Final on October 22<sup>nd</sup> where the Blue Dukes won 9-0. Goals by Nicolet, senior Will Smith, junior Breon Jarvis (2), junior John Began (2), sophomore Chris Luce and senior Santi Martinez-Ortiz. Assists were by Muderlak (2), Began (3), Nicolet, Kleiner and junior Franco Simone.

On October 27<sup>th</sup>, the boys opened up Sectional play vs fifth seeded Slinger. The Blue Dukes defeated Slinger 3-1 on October 11<sup>th</sup>, but knew that this game would be different. The team came out focused and composed and by the seventh minute had a 2-0 lead. The first goal came from Muderlak with a great pass by Triggs. A few moments later, Triggs found the back of the net with an assist from sophomore Jack McCauley. Slinger never stopped battling though and in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute scored to make the game a one goal lead for the Blue Dukes. Bay settled in a bit and scored the third goal right before halftime when Muderlak put away a long throw in by Smith to take a 3-1 lead into the half. Bay came out in the second half like they did to start the game and made it 4-1 on a goal from Nicolet, assisted by Hayes Drane.

The Blue Dukes will take on second seeded Nicolet at Lubar Stadium on October 29<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm with a trip to the WIAA State Tournament on the line. Be there to help the team back to State and their quest to bring home another gold ball to Whitefish Bay High School!



#### Varsity Girls Volleyball Team Beats Wauwatosa West in Playoffs, Drops to DSHA in Regional Final


### Cyber Security Club Competes in Competition

#### Varsity Football Team Finishes Season with a Win

#### Dukes Spoil Bulldogs (October 15, 2022)

The Whitefish Bay Blue Dukes played spoiler Friday night with a big 28-21 win over the Cedarburg Bulldogs, who would have advanced to the WIAA Playoffs with a win. The victory snapped a 4-game losing streak for Bay and ended a tough season on a high note.

Cedarburg struck first with a 12-play drive that ended in a touchdown to give themselves a 7-0 lead with just under 6 minutes left in the opening quarter. They wouldn't have another lead the rest of the game.

On the ensuing possession, sophomore running back Harry Bortolotti ripped off a 36-yard run on the Dukes' second play from scrimmage to put the Dukes O in business. Bortolotti, making his first career start in the backfield, rushed for 63 of his 80 total yards (12 carries) on the opening drive. Facing 4th-and-Goal from the 5-yard line, junior quarterback Ben Volpe turned a broken play into a score as he scrambled around the right side to tie the game at 7.

Senior Sean Callahan, wearing his Blue Dukes jersey for the last time, would take over from there. With the Bulldogs possessing the ball near midfield, they'd try to take a deep shot down the sideline when Callahan raced over for the interception that he'd return for a touchdown. Both teams would trade punts on their next possessions before Cedarburg tied the score at 14 with 33 seconds to go before half.

With great starting field position to open the second half, the Dukes would get the ball down to the Cedarburg 29 where they'd be faced with a 4th-and-5. The Dukes would convert, and in a big way. Callahan, split out to left, ran past his defender and reeled in a perfectly placed ball by Volpe in the back of the endzone to give the Blue Dukes a 21-14 lead in the third quarter.

The fourth quarter was drawing near when the Bulldogs tried to catch the Dukes sleeping, but they were stuffed on a fake punt in their own territory. Callahan then worked runs of 17, 11, 6, and 5 yards before finding pay dirt on a 5-yard toss for his third touchdown of the game that gave Bay a 28-14 lead. The senior finished with 64 yards on 10 carries.

The Bulldogs would answer on their next possession to make it a ballgame with 7 minutes remaining, but a Dukes D that played tough all night got off the field when it mattered most. A deep pass on 4th-and-16 from the Bulldogs on their own 33 was broken up, turning the ball over to Bay who would run the clock out for a much-needed victory.
