Varsity Boys Soccer Team Finishes Season as WIAA State Runner Up

The boys' varsity soccer team took on conference rival and second seeded Nicolet on October 29th with a trip to the WIAA State Tournament on the line. They boys came out fast and started putting pressure on Nicolet's defense early and often. In the 19th minute, senior co-captain Will Smith launched a throw in into the box and senior forward Alex Nicolet finished for an early 1-0 lead.

The Blue Dukes would take the 1-0 lead into halftime. In the second half, the team was on the attack again and scored two goals in 22 seconds. The first goal was by senior co-captain Henry Triggs from junior Quinn Muderlak and then 22 seconds later, freshman Tucker Drane converted a beautiful pass from Portugal sensation Sebastião Ferrão to extend the lead to 3-0. Finally, in the 70th minute Triggs scored on a header from Muderlak to seal the game and send the Blue Dukes to the WIAA State Tournament for the second consecutive year!

At the WIAA State Tournament, which was played at Uihlein Soccer Park, the Blue Dukes secured the number one seed and would face 4th seeded Pulaski on November 3rd. With a massive crowd of over 650 students supporting the Blue Dukes, they would take an early 1-0 lead from a header goal by Triggs in the second minute from Smith. In the 19th minute Smith would convert on a penalty kick to extend the lead 2-0.

Less than a minute later Pulaski would find the back of the net to make it 2-1. It would be the first goal the Blue Dukes had given up in the post season. The group would strike back with two more goals in the first half from Triggs and Ferrão and they headed into halftime up 4-1.

Pulaski would score late in the second half but time would run out and the Blue Dukes would be heading to the WIAA State Championship game for a rematch with Oregon High School on November 5th. In what could have been the worst weather in WIAA State Finals history (there was rain, snow, hail and wind gusts of 50 mph) the Blue Dukes elected to take the wind in the first half. After a few close chances, Muderlak hit a missile from the left side into the right corner of the net for a 1-0 lead.

That would be all the scoring in the first half for Whitefish Bay and now they would have to defend for their soccer lives in the second half vs not only Oregon but the weather which had taken a turn for the worse. With 4 1/2 minutes left in the game Oregon would find the equalizer off a dead ball on top of the box. That sent the game into overtime and after 100 minutes of soccer and the game still tied at 1 apiece and they would enter a penalty kick shootout to determine the winner.

After the first five shooters, the game was tied at 4-4 with a new 5 players selected to kick. Unfortunately, the Blue Dukes would fall 8-7 and for the second consecutive season take home the silver ball. It was an amazing season and the team left everything out on the pitch. Huge shout out to senior goalkeeper Austin Weinke for not only a tremendous season, but for one of the best performances in the state final the coaching staff has ever witnessed. Weinke had massive saves throughout the game including a penalty kick save that extended the shootout. Congratulations to the team for an amazing season. Congratulations to Will Smith for being voted the North Shore conference POY as well as First team All-State. Juniors Quinn Muderlak and Breon Jarvis were also voted first team all-conference as well as All State.



Varsity Girls Swim & Dive Team Make History

History has been made! Your 2022 WFB Girls Swim & Dive Team have completed their most historic season in school history.

After finishing the regular season undefeated, the Lady Dukes went on to win their first Conference title in 34 years. Swimming at West Bend High School on October 29th, the girls dominated from beginning to end, setting 7 conference records in the process, including in all three relays. Proving their depth has always been the strong suit, every single swim contributed points to the team total, making it near impossible to let one swimmer stand above the rest. The amount of success was rather overwhelming, but so hard-earned. The best times and smiles on the faces of all the girls proved the hard work was worth it!

Riding their winning ways, the Dukes would return to the pool a week later, this time playing host to their own WIAA DII Sectional on November 5th. Narrowly missing the sectional title last season, the Blue Dukes knew not only were state qualifying swims abound, but winning the sectional title was well within reach. 18 incredible dives and swims converged to yet again set history. With the help of two victories from senior captain Casey Stephens, and wins in both the 200 and 400 Free Relays, the Blue Dukes captured their first sectional title since 2006. In the process, 2 Divers, all 3 Relays, and 7 Individual swims would go on to qualify for the State Meet.

Never has a Girls' Swim and Dive Team at Whitefish Bay been able to place top 2 at all levels of postseason competition, but after a tremendous performance, your Lady Dukes of the pool finished Runner Up at the 2022 DII State Meet! Divers Ryann Wesley and Annika Leinweber held their own, placing 11th and 14th as they were seeded, both narrowly missing season-best scoring performances! Senior standout Casey Stephens and freshman phenom Anne Dickinson stole the show as they both collected 2 individual-podium finishes. Stephens would go on to place 5th in 200 freestyle and 2nd in the 500, both swims setting new school records! Anne would follow with a 2nd place 50 freestyle finish, and a 4th place in the 100 backstroke. Again, both swims would establish new school records! The Relays became a major highlight as the medley relay dropped even more time, placing 9th. The 200 and 400 Free Relays would both finish in 3rd place, also setting new school records in both. This gave the Blue Dukes SIX school records in the same evening! From moving up where they could, and a little help from the competition, WFB held off Ashwaubenon by a single point to bring home the runner-up trophy. Full results provided below!

Girls Lacrosse Information


