#### Varsity Boys Basketball Team is On a Roll

The Whitefish Bay Varsity Boys Basketball Team is not only playing their best basketball of the season, but arguably as good as anyone in the state of Wisconsin. The Blue Dukes are on a six game winning streak, their longest of the season and are heading into the postseason playing their best basketball.

The winning streak started on January 28th, when the Blue Dukes traveled to Germantown to take on Oak Creek in a non-conference match-up. Whitefish Bay opened the game by hitting their first three 3-point shots and raced out to a 27-5 lead. Oak Creek closed the gap to 30-18 at half time but the Blue Dukes extended the lead in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half by continually breaking the Oak Creek press to go on to win 65-34. Senior Jaden Guyton led Bay with 28 points and senior David Ackles had a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

The streak then continued into the North Shore Conference, first on January 31<sup>st</sup> as the Blue Dukes hosted the Grafton Blackhawks. Whitefish Bay trailed early in the game and was down 15-17 when freshman Marcus Webb hit a key 3 point shot that gave the Blue Dukes the lead for good. The Blue Dukes hit 7 of 15 3-point shots in a 71-52 victory. Guyton led all scorers with 34 points with three 3 point shots, Ackles had 22 points and 7 rebounds while senior Joah Lambrecht chipped in 5 points with 4 rebounds.

Whitefish Bay followed up Tuesday's win with a 61-50 victory at Cedarburg on Friday, February 3rd. The Blue Dukes raced out to an early doubledigit lead and led by 12 at halftime. Bay extended the lead to 17 points mid-way through the 2<sup>nd</sup> half before foul trouble hurt the Blue Dukes. Cedarburg made a run of their own and cut the lead down to 1 before senior Wes Ziel hit a key 3 point shot to put Bay back up by 4. Senior Jack Wright then hit some key free throws down the stretch to seal the victory. Guyton led Whitefish Bay with 22 points, Ziel had 15 points with two 3 point shots and 5 rebounds. Ackles contributed 10 points and 6 rebounds in the victory.

Next, the Blue Dukes had an impressive week, which earned them Journal Sentinel's Team of the Week recognition. The first beat Port Washington on February 7<sup>th</sup>, 67-57. Ziel led the team with 19 points, which was a career high for Ziel. Ackles (16), Guyton (14) and Lambrecht (10) also chipped in.

Next up, the Blue Dukes faced Nicolet, which is ranked #4 in Division 2 by the Wissports.net Boys Basketball Coaches Poll. The first half was a back and forth game, where both teams battled each other and couldn't create separation, which Nicolet taking a 26-25 lead into halftime. The first part of the 2<sup>nd</sup> half was the same, which both teams taking their turn in front without creating a big cushion. With around 8 minutes left, the Blue Dukes made the run that created that separation and grew the lead to 12 points and clinched the game with solid free throw shooting for an impressive 64-57 victory. Guyton had a memorable night with 42 points, which included shooting 50% from the field and 15 of 16 from the free throw line!

If you thought that victory was impressive, last night the Blue Dukes took on Greenfield, which was the 5<sup>th</sup> ranked team in Division 2 by the Wissports.net Boys Basketball Coaches Poll. This game, the Blue Dukes had control from the start. They took a 26-17 game into half and exploded for 42 points in the second half to give them another impressive victory, 68-46. Four players scored in double figures for the Blue Dukes, with Ziel leading the group with 14 points, senior Will Smith had a career high with 13 points, Ackles had 10 points and 4 blocks and senior Jack Wright chipped in with 10 points, 7 assists and 5 steals.

The team travels to West Bend East on Friday, February 17th and hosts Slinger on Thursday, February 23rd for their Senior Night.



### Blue Dukes Hope Buzzer Beater Builds Momentum for Playoffs

The Varsity Girls Basketball team stands with a record of 13-10 with 1 game remaining in the regular season. The Dukes recently completed a stretch of 5 of 6 games on the road including games against state ranked opponents Homestead, Cedarburg and Arrowhead. On February 7<sup>th</sup>, the Blue Dukes had a thrilling victory over Port Washington. With the score tied at 54, freshman Sage Miskel stole the ball on the baseline with 4.4 seconds left, she immediately weaved through traffic and shot the ball just beyond half court for the game winning shot at the buzzer!

They built a 20 point lead at halftime and never looked back as they won 78-36. The Blue Dukes were led by Sullivan who had 21 points and 8 rebounds, Lodl had 17 points, Miskel had 13 and 7 rebounds and Wallace had 10 points.

With three games remaining, the JV team has completed an incredible undefeated season to date! #### Blue Duke Boys Swim Team Making Noise in the Water

The Blue Dukes have laid claim to being one of the best in the state, and for the next few weeks, they will have every opport unity and more to prove their worth! Following their final regular season dual meet, vaulting the Boys Swim & Dive team to a 6-1 record, the Dukes traveled to Shorewood for the annual Small School State Invitational. Playing host to every D2 powerhouse, this "state -meet preview" proved there will be a nailbiter in Waukesha in a few short weeks. Finishing 3rd overall behind Shorewood and Rhinelander, the Dukes found themselves only 20 points away from winning the meet; a difference in swimming that is far too narrow to consider safe for anyone! Freshman diver Tyler Emory catapulted the team into the driver's seat with a tremendous 4th place finish, giving him promising looks at a podium finish at the state level. Versatility and depth would have all three Whitefish Bay Relays finishing in the top 5. Junior Backstroker Will Antonelli would go on to swim two season-best times, one in the 50 free, and a 4th place finish in the 100 backstroke. Senior Jack Gunderson and Finn Holdredge found themselves on the podium twice. Gunderson would take 5th in the 100 Free and an impressive second place in the 100 breast. Holdredge would match Gunderson's fifth place with one of his own in the 200 freestyle, and go on to win the 500 freestyle, posting the fastest time in the state to that point. In the end, every Whitefish Bay swimmer contributed massively, giving the Dukes a promising look at what could be at the state meet!

Shortly after, our JV Conference squad took to the waters of Cedarburg High School. A small but mighty team, five boys represented the Blue Dukes, and still competed to score an impressive 160 points! First-year diver Tome Gomez Taraud would complete his rookie campaign as champion, winning the JV Division of the Diving event! Freshman Simon Gahr would add to the win column, dropping a massive five seconds to win the 200 freestyle going away. Not to be outdone, Sophomore Dominic Cottrill would win the next individual event, the 200 IM. Going a lifetime best time by over 7 seconds, Cottrill led the race wire-to-wire, putting an emphasis on the prowess the Dukes show in the pool. Cottrill would later return for the 100 breaststroke, dropping yet another 4 seconds in the event to bring home second place. Rookie swimmers Rishon Ravin and Oliver Boyden would finish their season, hitting best times in both the 50 and 100 freestyles, and again on their relay splits! It was an impressive night for the Dukes, and more motivating to see their hard work come to fruition!

A short day later, the Varsity squad would head to Homestead for their shot at winning the Conference title. While they did close the gap by more than half their projected deficit, the D1 powerhouse Homestead took command early and didn't look back. However, the Whitefish Bay proved that they were also in a league of their own, taking second place in the meet by over 100 points over third. While the "household names" who we often hear from did their part, it was the depth of the Blue Dukes who shined. Sophomore Luke Sommer put together what of the most impressive meets possible. Dropping over 7.5 seconds in the 200 free, look moved up considerably to narrowly miss finishing on the podium in 9th place. Following that swim, which no one could quite comprehend, Sommer would drop another two seconds in the 100 freestyle, again providing big points for the team. Senior Logan Schmidt produced a wildly-fast 200 Individual Medley, dropping three seconds off his lifetime best time. In typical Logan-fashion, Schmidt dominated his 100 breaststroke heat, dropping three seconds on the season and put himself on the podium in 8th place. A swim that surprised no one, but made us all proud! Senior Brian Plemel joined in on the fun, dropping 6 seconds in his 200 freestyle, and a near impossible seventeen seconds in his 500 freestyle to contribute big points. The future looks bright, however, as numerous Freshman stepped up to build a promising future. Fischer Jakowski would go on to drop 4 seconds in his 200 Individual Medley with a TEN second drop, and followed suit with a 4 second drop of his 100 breaststroke.

With impressive swim after impressive swim, there's no clearer way to say these boys know what it takes to work hard and commit to what is possible. Playing host to their D2 Sectional last weekend, the Blue Dukes are ready to make a statement!
