### Varsity Softball Team Picking Up Wins, Already Exceeds Last Year's Total

A month into the season, the varsity Whitefish Bay softball team is showing signs that it can be a very competitive team this season. To date, the team is 4 and 3 overall and 2 and 3 in conference play. A huge boost for this success has been their team first mentality. That mentality has been led by seniors Eileen Carey, Izzy Starker and junior Grace Lodl.

Three of their wins were come from behind.

- 8 to 2 non-conference victory over Wauwatosa West
- North Shore Conference victory over Grafton 6 to 5
- North Shore Conference victory over Port Washington 29 to 19.

#### Tuesday, April 11th at Grafton

The Blue Dukes got down 5 to 0 after 3 innings. Bay got back into the game with 2 runs in the 4th inning.

Then in the 5th inning, Bay put 4 runs on the board to take a 6 to 5 lead. With sophomore Abby Fay pitching, Whitefish Bay shut Grafton down the final 3 innings. Fay pitched 6 solid innings recording 3 strikeouts allowing only 2 hits. Bay had several hitting stars: sophomore Kyla Sullivan led the attack with 3 hits including a double and 2 RBI. Juniors Taylor Hembel, Haley Solati and Lodl all had 2 hits and all three had doubles in the game. Senior Eileen Carey led the defense with several putouts in center field which included a game saving diving catch in the sixth inning. Sophomore Jane Wallace in left field had several nice catches to help solidify the defense.

#### Tuesday, April 18th at Port Washington

The Blue Dukes jumped out to a 9 to 4 lead after 1 inning with a Solati grand slam, the first of her varsity career. Bay then pushed the lead to 13 to 4 before Port Washington stormed back to take the lead 19-18 at the end of the 5<sup>th</sup> inning. In the top of the sixth inning, showing no fear, the Blue Dukes scored 11 runs to take a 29 to 19 lead.

In the final inning, junior Maddie Hartley was very sharp striking out the side to secure the win. Hembel, Fay and Hartley all made tremendous plays in the field.

Hitting stars were: Solati with 2 hits, a grand slam and 7 RBI. Sullivan with 3 hits including a grand slam, also her first career varsity homerun and 5 RBI. Junior Alex Peckey and Carey both had 2 hits, 2 RBI and a double. Lodl collected 3 RBI and Fay scored 4 times.

The other 2 wins this year were pitched and won by sophomore Serena Shunneson who only gave up only 2 total runs in both games.

The JV team is playing well with 2 wins this season beating Grafton and Homestead. Sophomore Josie Flanagan continues to work hard pitching, notching both wins. Sophomore Oliva Robinson has made several nice catches in the outfield.

The next varsity game is Monday vs Nicolet on April 24 at Whitefish Bay. Game time is 6:15 pm.

### Young Varsity Boys Tennis Team Does Well in Premier Invitational

The Whitefish Bay varsity boys' tennis team is led by juniors and sophomores (10 of our 12, with the other 2 being freshmen) The young team competed in one of the premier Wisconsin high school tennis tournaments drawing the top teams in the State and finished 12th of 32 teams on April 14<sup>th</sup> and April 15th.

The Blue Dukes had big wins over Mukwonago (5-2) and Badger Lake Geneva (4-3) and had narrow losses to Germantown and Nicolet both 3-4.

The team this week has dedicated itself to improving so they can compete for a North Shore conference title and Sectional championship. Juniors Ty Schneider and Matthew Noack led our group both going 4-1 in their individual matches over the weekend. Schneider and Noack both had statement wins over Nicolet, claiming their stake as the top singles players in the North Shore Conference. Schneider won 6-0, 6-0 at 1 singles and Noack won 7-5, 6-0 at 2 singles.

The Blue Dukes next travel to Brookfield Central on April 24th.

### Varsity Boys Track Team's Season Looking Promising

The 2023 Boys Track & Field season has gotten out of the blocks to a great start. The Blue Dukes have competed well this season adding depth, over 70 athletes competing, which is the most in 5 years and bringing back key varsity experience from last year. The Dukes look to capitalize on last year's state experience with sending more kids than ever.

Team leader and captain senior Will Smith has picked right back up where he left off dropping some impressive times. One time in particular was a 49.5 in the open 400-meter on April 14<sup>th</sup> at Franklin High School where Smith was just .5 tenths away from beating the school record which stands at 49.02 held by current coach Davontae Johnson.

Sophomore Jacob Jones and newcomer, senior AJ Springer have set the tone for the distance crew putting in amazing performances this year, both winning in the mile and 800-meter appearances in some big meets this year.

Stepping out of his comfort zone has been senior Thor Gabik. Gabik has entered into the world of hurdles this year and has posted a very competitive time in the 300 low hurdles in his first race. Gabik has already run sub 45 seconds and looks to continue to improve and add more depth to the boy's team.

Sophomores Joe Lee and Wyatt Van Dyke have been impressive both running extremely well and improving weekly. These two young stars have served as double duty at times as they compete on JV and Varsity which brings the team depth. Lee has posted a PR in the 100 meters with an 11.85 and Wyatt has posted a PR in back to back weeks running 24.4 in the 200-meter race.

Junior Ryan Scarlet is jumping well as he PR in the Triple jump looking to improve and add to his state campaign. He has already jumped over 40feet and is rapidly improving. As we get into the season the Dukes are gearing up for a good North Shore Conference showing and inserting ourselves in the conversation in the North Shore.

You can share this link with friends and family as this is a community-wide event. Any outside guests can check in through the main office upon arrival. The event will be held in the Field House.


