# Whitefish Bay's Rock Climbing Team Wins State Championship

Seventeen members of the Whitefish Bay Climb Team made history on Saturday, May 6th at the Wisconsin High School Climbing League State Championship. Despite the 42 competitors on the rival Kettle Moraine team, the Bay climbers secured an impressive 612 collective points in Qualifiers alone, beating Kettle Moraine's 578 points. From there, a record-breaking eight of the seventeen Bay climbers went through to State Finals, where they collectively scored an additional 204 points.

In D1 Finals, Bay climbers swept the podium. Sophomore Em Koshkin seized the title of State Champion in D1 females with 28 points, with senior Sophie McDonald as State runner up with 25 points. Also, in D1 females were seniors Hillary Paslaski in 3rd place and Ramona Cloud in 4th. Senior Lu VanDyke's 3rd place win in D1 males marked the Bay team's fifth podium placement of the day.

Junior Owen Wallace became the Bay team's second individual State Champion, securing first place in D2 males with 35 points. Also, in D2 males was junior Christian Zastava, who secured 4th place with 30 points, narrowly missing 3rd place by just 2 points. Senior Lola Rigano tied in finals with 28 points and placed 2nd overall in D3 females, earning the second title as State Runner up for the Bay team that day.

The team's accomplishments did not stop there. With the amazing efforts of the entire team in Qualifiers and the spectacular performances by the eight finalists, the Whitefish Bay Climb Team collectively earned a total of 816 points, earning them the title of 2023 Wisconsin High School Climbing League State Champions. This is the first year a Bay climber, not to mention two, took first in their individual division at State and also marks the first time in 8 years Whitefish Bay took home a team trophy, making the May 6th State competition truly one for the books. What a way to close the season!



As both players competed against players from programs in the top five in the state, these finishes were excellent individual results for Schneider and Schutz.

# Girls Soccer Team on Six Game Winning Streak

The mid-season journey for Whitefish Bay Varsity Golf was like riding a rollercoaster, with tornado watches, a surprising three-day spell of scorching 85° weather in April, and then a sudden drop to 40° temperatures accompanied by rain delays.

On the 28th of April, the team headed to Hawthorne Hills GC for the Kelly Green Port Washington Invitational. Demonstrating their exceptional skills, the boys shot a remarkable total score of 317 strokes, securing a well-deserved 2nd place finish among 20 highly competitive teams. Seniors Jake Barry and Carter Schmidt took the lead, showcasing their individual brilliance by carding impressive scores of 75 and 76, respectively. Their outstanding performance landed both seniors in the top 5 out of a field of 98 players.

Following a couple of un-noteworthy conference tournaments, the team bounced back during the final North Shore Conference tournament, achieving their season's best score of 154 strokes. This granted them a well-deserved second-place finish, trailing only one stroke behind Hartford Union High School.

With their spirits lifted, the boys are now eager to carry this positive momentum into the North Shore Conference Championship. The North Shore Conference Championship holds significant importance for the team as it marks the final conference match for five exceptional seniors: Jake Barry, Carter Schmidt, Nate Twente, Johnny Guo, and Connor Knapp. These outstanding athletes are determined to leave their mark on the course and conclude their high school careers on a high note. 
#### Whitefish Bay vs Brown Deer/Shorewood (Doubleheader) - May 10th



# Varsity Baseball Team Tied for 1st in the North Shore Conference with 2 Games to Go

The Whitefish Bay Blue Duke baseball team remains at the top of the conference with a 10-6 conference record. Arguably the biggest highlight of the year came Wednesday May 10<sup>th</sup> versus Cedarburg where the Blue Dukes won 21-0. Junior Alex Broderson starred as he threw a five inning perfect game with only 45 pitches!
